Acts 17:22-28

### I. Two Presuppositions:

1. Worship is the activity of the human soul.

2. Worship is more about what we do than what we say.

### II. Worship is whenever you and I determine something is worth something to us.

### III. The issue for you and me is not the quality of our worship,

but rather the object of our worship.

1. The sermon defined worship as “our response to what we value most” and “declaring what we value most.” Is this a new or larger way of looking at worship for you? In what ways does it make you question or rethink the way you’ve viewed worship before?
2. The sermon also asserted that all of us are always worshipping. Have you recognized this to be true in your life or those around you? Can you see it in your choices and actions over the past twenty-four hours?
3. For most people you know, what would you say appear to be the most common objects of their worship, other than God? How about you?
4. How can we go about deciding – in an honest and thorough way – what it is we value most in life? How do we effectively and accurately “follow the trail” in order to evaluate how we spend our time? Our affection? Our energy? Our money? Our allegiance?
5. Here are some scripture passages to explore and discuss together: Colossians 1:15-17; John 1:1-3; 1 Corinthians 8:5-6.
