1. What makes new things desirable to us? What are the desirable qualities they have?

2. In what ways do people long to be made new?

3. Read Ephesians 4:17-19. Apart from Christ, people are described as darkened in understanding, alienated from the life of God, and hard hearted. In your own words, explain each.

4. How can we point people to the Gospel if they are darkened in understanding, alienated from the life of God, and hard hearted?

5. We can combat the callousing effect of sin by constantly asking two questions in life: "What is God saying to me?" and "What am I going to do about it?" How would you currently answer each of these questions?

6. Read Ephesians 4:20-24. We are told to put off the old self, renew our minds, and put on our new self. In very practical ways how do we:
