Matthew 7:1-6

Two Extremes of Judging Others:

- 1. Having a <u>harsh</u>, <u>critical</u> spirit
- 2. Having a spirit of permissiveness

Judging is <u>necessary</u>, but dangerous.

Critical judgments come <u>naturally</u>.

The right way to judge is charitably.

Action Steps to Promote Peace:

- 1. Take care of <u>our junk</u> first.
 - a. How can I show Jesus' work in me by taking responsibility for my contribution to this conflict?
- 2. A gracious, gentle attitude can prevent most conflicts.
- 3. Know your <u>idol</u>.
- 4. Confession brings freedom.

Community Group Questions

- 1. What is your natural tendency when dealing with others? Do you tend to have a critical spirit or do you more readily offer others the benefit of the doubt? Do you believe that by having a gracious, gentle attitude that you can prevent most conflicts? Why or why not? Discuss what offenses you may not be able to overlook.
- 2. What kind of "logs" are you currently dealing with in your own eyes?
- 3. Do you currently have any unresolved conflict in your life? At home, work, with anyone at Crossroads? How can I (we) show Jesus' work in me by taking responsibility for my contribution to this conflict?
- 4. Read Philippians 4:4-9 aloud as a group. Come up with at least 4 principles on peacemaking from this passage (there are 5 represented in the text). Choose one to work on in your life this week.
