5. How have you been affected by original sin? How has sin affected our relationship with God? Do you feel a sense of unfairness for being counted guilty due to Adam's sin? (Romans 5:12-21). How can you deal with this sense of unfairness to keep it from becoming a hindrance in your relationship with God?
6. How does God view and respond to sin? Do you think Christians today have lost sight of the hatefulfulness of sin to a large extent? How about unbelievers? Do you think that we as Christians have lost sight of the thoroughgoing pervasiveness of sin in unbelievers, and of the truth that the greatest problem in the human race is not a lack of education, communication or, material well-being, but sin against God?
7. In what ways has your view of sin been challenged by this sermon & discussion?
8. In what ways are you tempted? What areas do you readily fall prey to when it comes to sin? Do you know your propensities?
9. How do you respond to sin in your life? How do you respond to sin in others' lives?
